

# Serra graduate Alzo will speak at meeting

Serra Catholic High School alumnus Lisa A. Alzo, author of "Three Slovak Women," will speak at the next Homestead and Mifflin Township Historical Society.

Her recent book, "Three Slovak Women," is a non-fiction account of three generations of Slovak women in Duquesne.
